ANTHEMION AWARDS

An "anthemion" is a classical design element dating from Ancient Greece that is inspired by the fan-shaped leaves of a palm tree.

"Anthemion" is the Greek word for "flower."

Capital Area Preservation, Inc (CAP) presents Anthemion Awards annually to:

- Recognize and honor outstanding dedication and commitment to excellence in historic preservation in Wake County, North Carolina
- Assist in saving endangered historic properties
- Promote public awareness of and appreciation for the preservation of Wake County's architectural and cultural heritage

CAP is Wake County's primary non-profit historic preservation organization. CAP's mission is to advocate and invest in the preservation of historic resources as an essential element of Wake County's growth.

ELIGIBILITY

Individuals, businesses, organizations, and governments whose efforts have contributed significantly to the preservation, restoration, rehabilitation, adaptive use, or interpretation of Wake County's architectural or cultural heritage are eligible for nomination.

Projects completed within the last three calendar years are considered. Self-nominations are welcomed.

CATEGORIES

Nominations can recognize contributions in a variety of areas including, but not limited to:

- Residential • Commercial • Landscape
- Adaptive Use • Advocacy • Leadership
- Professional Commitment • Education
- Craftsmanship • Lifetime Achievement
- Neighborhood and Community

JUDGING

Nominations are judged individually and not in competition with each other or by category. A jury comprised of preservation and design professionals makes recommendations to the Board of Directors.

General evaluation criteria:

- Quality and degree of difficulty of effort
- Impact on community

TO NOMINATE

Submit the completed Nomination Form and the following info on one disk.

1. A one-page description of the project or effort being nominated.
2. For projects include:
 - Location map
 - Minimum of 4 color photographs of property or project
 - List of all key project contributors (i.e., owner, architect, contractor, etc..) & contact information for each.
3. (Optional) Supporting material such as architectural drawings, project history and news articles can be included.
